- Investigator's bombshell charge in court documents

master bedroom! Davern, who passed a police polygraph test, accused Natalie's husband of delaying the search for the beauty.

In 2011, the L.A. County Sheriff's Department reopened the case. Chief Medical Examiner Dr. Lakshmanan Sathyavagiswaran uncovered unexplained fresh bruising on Natalie's right forearm, left wrist, and right knee along with a scratch on her neck and a superficial scrape on her forehead.

The shocking discovery led the coroner to conclude she could have been beaten before drowning. He noted the evidence supports "bruising having occurred prior to entry in the water." As a result, the official

cause of Natalie's death was changed from "accidental drowning" to "drowning and other undetermined factors."

Now Perroni has filed a lawsuit in L.A. demanding the Sheriff and Medical Examiner release all their files on the case. A court hearing on his request — for photos of her body and items removed from the yacht — is scheduled for later this month.

According to Perroni, the yacht's master bedroom was reported to be "a wreck" by some witnesses.

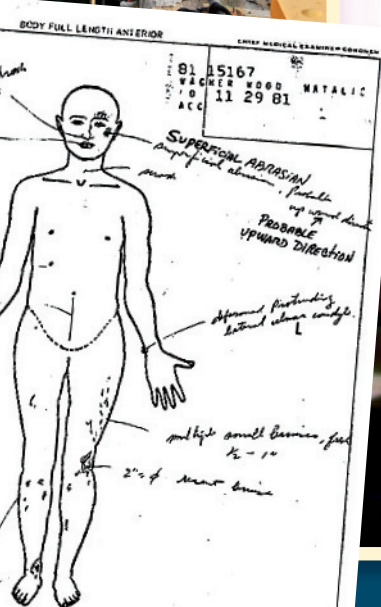

are no pictures in police files it "would suggest a further attempt to cover up evidence pointing to a crime."

Perroni also notes that Marti Rulli, co-author of "Goodbye Natalie, Goodbye Splendour," agrees with his conclusions.

She says "evidence shows Natalie was NOT conscious in the water" and the yacht skipper's revelations about an argument is "compelling evidence that Wagner...should be arrested immediately."
